



Rajkumar College was originally founded at Jabalpur in 1882 and later on shifted to Raipur as a Chief's College with the intention of educating the sons of Rulers and Zamindars of Eastern State Agency. In 1939 admission was thrown open to boys without distinction of class, creed or caste.

The college has spacious buildings, grounds and playing field spread over 115 acres of land. The main building houses some of the class rooms of the Senior section and two boarding houses namely B.D.B.H. & R.D.B.H. Behind the main building and attached to it are the Stow Hall, Sarangarh Dining Hall and Vidya Bhawan. The Stow Hall is used for some college functions and is daily used for morning assembly. The Sarangarh Dining Hall was opened by H.E.Dr.Rajendra Prasad, the President of India. The Jashpur Hall, a bigger auditorium is used for major functions and combined assemblies. It was in Jashpur Hall where the 1<sup>st</sup> Assembly of Chhattisgarh Legislature was held in November 2000.

M.P.House accommodates the Middle School and was opened by Hon'ble Shri P.C.Sethi, the Chief Minister of M.P. Tagore House; a separate section for students of Junior Section was opened by Pt.Jawahar Lal Nehru in 1963. The school has a well equipped hospital, mess, library, computer lab, guest house and a swimming pool. Affiliated to the Council for Indian School

Certificate Examinations, New Delhi it is the founder member of Indian Public School Conference. All major games are played here including Cycle polo, Billiards, Horse riding, Shooting, Archery and recently a Squash Court is under construction. It is mainly a boarding school but has also allowed both boys and girls as day boarders and day scholars.

Having completed 128 years the school boasts of an excellent result in both the Board Exams. Our ex-students have done well in politics, judiciary, administrative and foreign services and also in the field of business.
